On behalf of the Department of History, I am please to inform you that you have been selected to receive the Henry Horwitz Prize for the best syllabus by a graduate instructor in History for a course taught in the spring 2011 or fall 2011 semester. This prize comes with a monetary award of \$300 which will be made available to you by August 1, 2012.

The Fall of Carthage and the Rise of Rome syllabus conveys to students a sense of excitement about the field and suggests all the possibilities of discovery. As an intensive approach to the sources, the syllabus is highly original, well-researched and carefully planned. The assignments are thoughtful and meticulously explained, thereby giving young students a lot of guidance.

The prize's namesake, Professor Emeritus Henry Horwitz, was a member of the History faculty from 1963-2004. His research and publications focused mainly on Early Modern England and English Legal History. During his tenure, he recognized a need for the historical perspectives coursework and was involved in the development of the Issues and Diversity courses as they are currently being taught.
